The Lord's Supper is for all who trust in Jesus Christ for salvation, have been baptized, and are a part of any Bible-believing church.

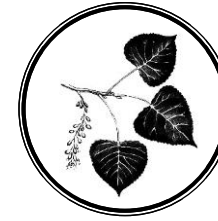
